Delhi Charter Township - Sample Ballot

A sample ballot for the November 4, 2008 General Election follows on the next three pages. Use this sample to help prepare for Election Day. You can mark your choices on this sample ballot to take with you to the polls to help you mark your official ballot. The official ballot is larger and has two sides.

TO VOTE: Complete the arrow opposite each choice as shown: ←■

IMPORTANT: To mark your ballot, use only a black or blue ink pen. **DO NOT USE ANY OTHER INK COLOR!**

PARTISAN SECTION: To vote the partisan section of the ballot, you may cast a "straight ticket," a "split ticket" or a "mixed ticket."

Straight Ticket: Vote the party of your choice. Nothing further need be done in the partisan section.

Split Ticket: You may vote a straight ticket AND vote for individual candidates of your choice.

Mixed Ticket: Vote for the individual candidates of your choice in each office.

NONPARTISAN and **PROPOSAL SECTIONS** of the ballot must be voted separately.

DO NOT vote for more candidates than indicated under each office title.

WRITE-IN CANDIDATES: To vote for a candidate whose name is not printed on the ballot, write or place the name of that candidate in the blank space provided and complete the arrow (Blank space for write-ins do not appear on the sample ballot because of space constrictions). This must be done even if you cast a straight party vote. Do not cast a write-in vote for a candidate whose name is already printed on the ballot for that office. (for write-in votes to count, the candidate must be a declared write-in candidate.)

CHECK BOTH SIDES OF THE BALLOT: The official ballot has two sides. Be certain to check the reverse side of the ballot.

WHEN YOU HAVE COMPLETED VOTING: Place the ballot in the secrecy sleeve so that the votes cannot be seen and the numbered stub is visible. Return the ballot to the election official stationed at the tabulator.

NOTE: If you make a mistake, return your ballot to the election official and obtain a new ballot. Do not attempt to erase or correct any marks made in error.

PROPOSAL 08-1
A LEGISLATIVE INITIATIVE TO PERMIT THE USE AND CULTIVATION OF MARIJUANA FOR SPECIFIED MEDICAL CONDITIONS
The proposed law would:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Permit physician approved use of marijuana by registered patients with debilitating medical conditions including cancer, glaucoma, HIV, AIDS, hepatitis C, MS and other conditions as may be approved by the Department of Community Health. • Permit registered individuals to grow limited amounts of marijuana for qualifying patients in an enclosed, locked facility. • Require Department of Community Health to establish an identification card system for patients qualified to use marijuana and individuals qualified to grow marijuana. • Permit registered and unregistered patients and primary caregivers to assert medical reasons for using marijuana as a defense to any prosecution involving marijuana.

PROPOSAL 08-2

A PROPOSAL TO AMEND THE STATE CONSTITUTION TO ADDRESS HUMAN EMBRYO AND HUMAN EMBRYONIC STEM CELL RESEARCH IN MICHIGAN

The proposed constitutional amendment would:

- Expand use of human embryos for any research permitted under federal law subject to the following limits: the embryos --

-- are created from fertility treatment purposes;

-- are not suitable for implantation or are in excess of clinical needs;

-- would be discarded unless used for research;

-- were donated by the person seeking fertility treatment.

- Provide that stem cells cannot be taken from human embryos more than 14 days after cell division begins.
- Prohibit any person from selling or purchasing human embryos for stem cell research.
- Prohibit state and local laws that prevent, restrict or discourage stem cell research, future therapies and cures.

CAPITAL AREA TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY (CATA) MILLAGE PROPOSITION

CITY OF LANSING, CITY OF EAST LANSING, MERIDIAN TOWNSHIP, LANSING TOWNSHIP and DELHI TOWNSHIP

Shall the public transportation authority, the Capital Area Transportation Authority (CATA), for continued service, as provided for by Public Act 55 of 1963, as amended, levy additional taxes in an amount not to exceed 0.787 mill (that being \$0.787 per thousand dollars of taxable value) on real and personal property located within the City of Lansing, City of East Lansing, Meridian Township, Lansing Township and Delhi Township for the years 2008 through 2012 inclusive? If approved and levied, this millage would generate approximately \$4,750,000.00 in 2008.

MILLAGE RENEWAL PROPOSAL

This Proposal will allow the Charter Township of Delhi to maintain the millage levied for Fire Department purposes on all taxable property and renews the millage that expired with the 2008 tax levy.

Shall the previously voted increase in the authorized charter millage for the Charter Township of Delhi which may be assessed on all taxable property as defined by law within said Township be renewed at one-half (1/2) mill (\$.50 per \$1,000.00 of taxable valuation) for a period of six (6) years, 2009 through 2014, inclusive, for the purpose of defraying, in whole or in part, the cost of operating the Delhi Charter Township Fire Department, including, but not limited to, acquisition, repair, replacement and maintenance of Fire Department personnel, which levy is estimated to raise, in the first year of the levy, an estimated \$404,279?
